Climate Change and Walk to School Week, week beginning: 31 March

As part of our curriculum work on climate change and the impact this can have on the environment, we have been learning all about the little differences we can make in our everyday lives to contribute positively to the prevention of the negative impact of climate change.

One of the messages we will be sharing with the children is the impact of our 'carbon footprint' and how this can affect changes in climate. As part of raising awareness of

New Leave of Absence Form Trial

We are introducing a new Leave of Absence Form for parents and carers to complete should they request to take their child out of school during term time. We have included the codes school need to use on our school registers which provides the local authority with the reason why a child is not in school.
